Story of impact

Bringing music to hospice and home health patients.

Home is a place of comfort and safety. It's where we have good moments and tough ones; where we heal and recharge ourselves. For many, it's a haven for healing after a hospital stay, managing pain following an injury, or experiencing terminal illness.

SSM Health Hospice and Home Health programs and initiatives work to improve and deepen the experiences of those who receive care at home. One program, Peaceful Harmony Music Therapy, uses music to promote wellness, manage stress, alleviate pain, enhance memory, improve communication, and provide unique opportunities for interaction with family and friends.

For seven years, Music Therapist Brian Hildebrand has traveled to patients' homes — near and far — to bring healing through the strum of his guitar, the beat of his drum, and the shake of an egg shaker.


Brian's latest venture with music therapy is creating songs using a recording of his patient's heartbeat. He first heard about the heartbeat recording at a music therapy conference and has since incorporated it into SSM Health's service offerings. Brian gathered the recording tools to make it happen, and he has produced 10 personalized songs for families, providing them with a memory that will last a lifetime.

Story of impact

Providing hope amid uncertainty.

An undiagnosed illness is both confusing and frightening. The patient and their family embark on a lonely journey to multiple websites, then specialists, tests, and imaging studies. It can seem like there is no way out — that there is nowhere else to turn.

For years, Nick was violently ill, unable to eat, maintain a proper weight, and even missed his college graduation. No doctor he had visited to that point could determine the underlying cause. Eventually, Dr. Leonard Weinstock, a gastroenterologist in St. Louis, connected Nick and his family to Dr. Laurence Kinsella, who works at SSM Health St. Clare Hospital - Fenton and is certified in internal medicine, neurology, neuromuscular medicine, electromyography, and autonomic disorders.

Nick and his family were unsure if Dr. Kinsella would be able to help them after so many diagnoses yet no successful treatments. However, Dr. Kinsella knew that the doctor-patient connection was one of the most important aspects of care during such an uncertain time. He sat with Nick and his parents, asking them questions about when Nick was last well and hearing about their journey to St. Clare Hospital. Together, they worked on a plan to help Nick get better, including diagnosing him with Mast Cell Activation Syndrome (MCAS) and a thoracic cerebrospinal fluid leak (CSF).

Focused treatment started, and Nick's health began to improve bit by bit. SSM Health gave Nick and his family hope that their tumultuous health journey was coming to an end. "The culture of SSM Health is: 'You are in the right place,'" said Diana Jesperson, Nick's mother.

Today, Nick is happy and healthy, and he is on the path to becoming a doctor — to give hope and healing to his future patients in the same way Dr. Kinsella did for him.

Story of impact

Serving those in need.

Having a well-rounded diet impacts more than hunger levels. Not having access to healthy food can also affect an individual's overall health and could lead to chronic illnesses, such as diabetes and heart disease.

More than 160,000 people in St. Louis County, St. Louis City, and St. Charles County are food insecure. And more than 50% of that group is above the SNAP threshold of 130% poverty, which means they do not qualify for extra support to provide their families with nutritious essential food.

SSM Health is committed to the overall health of our neighbors — not just treating the physical symptoms, but also addressing the elements that are underlying causes of illness. Our Bread Basket program works to bring food that will strengthen and support our patients after they leave our hospital. Patients are given two days of non-perishable food for their household, as well as longer-term resources from the St. Louis Area Foodbank's Community Resource Team.

After expanding the screening from SSM Health DePaul - St. Louis Hospital to be regionwide, the number of patients identifying as food insecure nearly tripled, and SSM Health saw the need in our community to expand the program. In mid-November of 2023, the Bread Basket program was ready to serve across seven SSM Health hospitals. Before the end of the year, 188 individuals were helped through the inpatient component of the Bread Basket program.



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We know that access to healthy foods is a social determinant of health, and it is our responsibility to ensure we do what we can to help garner access to food for those in need.


