The why: Heart health is St. Louis' #1 health concern

Nationally, heart disease is the leading cause of death for men and women. 6.2 million Americans are currently experiencing heart failure, and heart disease mortality rates in St. Louis remain above the U.S. average. By identifying the silent symptoms of advancing heart failure, managing heart disease before it progresses, and reducing hospitalizations, our community can stabilize and continue toward a healthier, stronger future.



The need: Reduce the impact of heart disease on our neighbors

The tiny device transmits information about Terrance's heart health to his provider, who monitors Terrance's condition and can make real-time recommendations to help him continue to live an active, fulfilled life.
